Know Your Roots

How Frank Got His Last Name By Audrey Hinton

Our forefather, Frank, and his four brothers, Alexander, Henry, Daniel, and William, were known as the "Garrett Brothers" while enslaved to Thomas Henton III in Versailles, Kentucky. They took the surname of their father, Henry Garrett.

In September 1864 they escaped from their owner and enlisted in the Civil War as members of the 12th Heavy Artillery Unit of the United States

Colored Troops. Military regulations required them to use their

o w n e r 's name, not their own. The enlistment officer, h o w e v e r, spelled their



name "Hinton," not "Henton."

"I thought best to stick to the Hinton name, which I established while a soldier." *Frank Garrett Hinton*

When they mustered out in 1866, Frank's brothers resumed using the surname "Garrett." But Frank, who had attained the rank of corporal during the War and was surely very proud of his service, kept the surname "Hinton." When asked years later why he did so, he said, "I thought best to stick to the Hinton name, which I established while a soldier."
